The beautiful mature trees that line our streets, shade our yards and offer habitat for local wildlife are one of the loveliest features of our wonderful community. These trees are beautiful and thrive in our environment, but they must be properly maintained. As a policy, the Association does not "lace" any trees, because this has a tendency to stimulate growth and encourage trees to become overly large.

Some homeowners voiced concerns regarding the size of the trees and potential safety issues they may cause. As a result of these concerns, the HOA contracted with a licensed arborist to do a tree survey for our community. In August, the arborist looked at all trees that are serviced by the Association sprinkler system lines. The purpose of the survey was to identify any trees that might be the subject of tree pathogens (disease and/or insect infestation) and/or root stability and safety.

As a result of the arborist's findings, the Association has been working diligently to rectify all issues that were noted as needing attention. We continue to do our best to keep our trees healthy and safe for all to enjoy. - ❖ Treasurer's Report
  - All representative HOAs have made contributions based on one dollar per household.

## Community News

- Free proposed project to add Retail Space in the Vons shopping center is officially dead. Previous SHAG meetings brought to light concerns which ultimately may have been factors causing the developer to not go forward with the project. I know parking, for one, was a concern that was discussed, but there were other concerns (don't know what they were) presented to the developer without any response.
- ➤ The Flower Hill Shopping Center is about to undergo new development that will double its size. The project will include:
  - Addition of 56,000 sq ft of office space
  - Addition of a public plaza
  - Addition of 70,000 sq ft of retail and restaurant space
  - Razing the 4-plex movie theater and rebuilding as a 6-plex
- ➤ The city is preparing to award a contract for a study of the traffic flow in the Solana Vista School zone.
- Community Emergency Response Training
  - > Steve Goetsch recently underwent the CERT "Community Emergency Response Team" training and gave a brief talk of what the training entailed. Basically, the purpose of this program is to train participants to become disaster workers, including basic life-and-property-saving- skills, in the event of a major disaster.

Steve passed out a Family Disaster Plan and Personal Survival Guide that families in our community may find very helpful and beneficial. This Guide may be found at the San Diego County OES (Office of Emergency Services) Website.
